As I recently preached on Hannah, the wife who prayed for a son and miraculously gave birth to a boy who would become the great Old Testament Prophet Samuel, I ran across an illustration I had never heard before. E.V. (Ed) Hill, who pastored Mt. Zion Missionary Baptist Church in Los Angeles for 42 years, tells the story of how the love and prayers of his adopted "Mama" changed his life. Mama believed in two things: Prayer and Ed. She saw to it that he graduated from high school and even insisted that he go to college. As he boarded the bus to leave for college, Mama said to him, "Remember, Mama is praying for you."

When he arrived at Prairie View College in his native Texas, he stood in the registration line and soon learned that the \$1.90 he had left from his bus trip would not pay for his tuition, room and board. He started to get out of line, but then remembered his Mama's words. She was praying for him.

As it came his turn to register, Dr. J.M. Drew approached him and asked if he was Ed Hill from Sweet Home, Texas. Ed told him he was, then Dr. Drew said, "We have a four-year scholarship that will pay your room and board, your tuition, and give you thirty dollars a month to spend." And Ed says he heard his Mama say, "I will be praying for you!" Indeed, there is great power in a mama's prayers!

July has been a good month with 314 in Bible Study. I am so proud of you for meeting and exceeding our Annie Armstrong North American Missions Offering goal of \$15,000 with a total of \$15,4412.26.
