#### INGREDIENTS

3/4 cup scalded milk	1/4 cup meltec
1 egg beaten	butter
1/4 cup honey	1 teaspoon sal <sup>-</sup>
2 cups of flour	flat cookie pan parchment pap

\*\*\*have about another half cup of flour ready for kneading and rolling the bread

### DIRECTIONS

1. Mix the milk, honey, and the butter together

- 2. Add in the egg
- 3. Gradually add the salt and the 2 cups of flour. (The dough will be sticky)
- 4. Put the dough out on the floured parchment paper and knead
- the bread dough using the extra flour. 5. Roll out the dough flat on the pan with parchment paper (about
- 1/4" thickness) and prick the dough with a fork
- 6. Bake at 375 degrees for about 15 to 20 minutes
