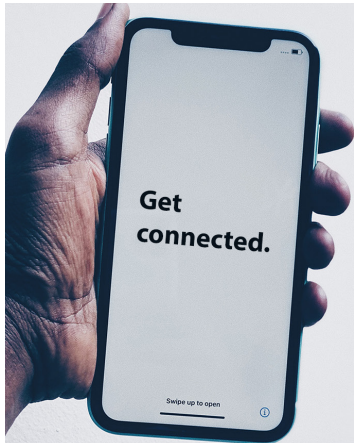

MAKING MUCH OF JESUS

with Pastor Jason Teal

And the master said to the servant, **'Go out** to the highways and hedges and **compel** people to come in, that my house may **be filled**.

-Luke 14:23

In His parable of the Great Banquet, Jesus shared a story of a man who once gave a great banquet and invited a ton of people. When everything was ready for the great feast, the guests were notified. Upon notification, they began to make excuses. Some of these excuses were ones that we might have used from time to time to get out of something that might have been an inconvenience. One had bought a field and just needed to go see it. Another had gotten married and apparently the wife wasn't interested. The end result was a master that was greatly angered that those who were invited neglected to see the importance of attending.

Sadly, for many people in this world, they have been invited by the Gospel to partake in the joy of Jesus' banqueting table. Yet, they have often found "more important" things to tend to. However, there are some who have yet to get the invite. It is bad enough that those invited should not come, but what of those who have yet to be invited. Should they miss out on a great feast, on a great celebration, on eternal life?

In the parable, the master immediately tells the servant to go quickly to the streets inviting anyone who is poor, crippled, blind,

or lame. Apparently, this is a great party in a grand room because after inviting these, the servant expressed that there was still room. The master then tells him to go out to the highways and hedges and compel people to come in. Why, do you ask? So that His house might be filled. The master has called us to go out to the highways and hedges or better yet, to our schools, our jobs, our neighbors, our grocery stores, our families, and so on, so that they might receive the invitation that is there for them to come to Jesus. He says that we are to compel them to come. The word, compel, means to necessitate a response to the invitation. I believe He uses this word as an active statement to show the importance of bringing others into God's Kingdom.

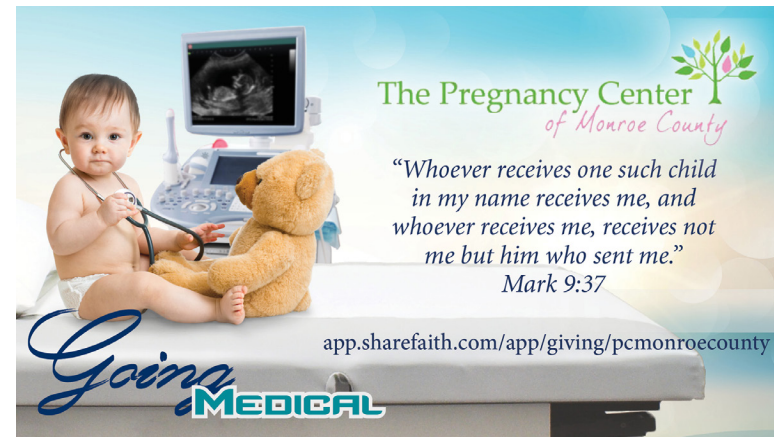
